Quarantine Processes

We want families to know that any item sent into our school from your homes must quarantine for three days prior to any staff handling/opening. This process is based on directions from public health and COVID-19 protocols. We would ask families not to send in cards for us to deliver to other children.



Kindness Counts!

We are focussed on using W.I.T.S strategies to support students to be kind and more independent in solving social challenges. You might like to talk in your homes about how we can Walk away, Ignore, Talk things out and Seek help to solve social conflicts. Your child might be able to say the WITS acronym but may need help putting it in action. Role-playing, discussions and suggesting the use of supportive statements are all ideas that can help our children work through problems that can arise with peers.

During each week, as students are "caught" using kindness and their W.I.T.S they can earn tickets for random draws every Friday. We are committed to promoting a safe and positive learning environment at Maynard every day.

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Winter Weather Update: As has been shared with our families, if we have inclement weather, schools will be CLOSED to students on these days when busses are cancelled. Our educators have taken your input on whether "paper copy" or "digital" learning materials will be used for learning on any Remote Learning Days due to inclement weather. If you have not connected with your child's teacher, based on the feedback form in the letter sent home to all families by Mrs. MacDonald on Thursday November 19, 2020, please do so as soon as possible. The learning materials provided on these days will be for review and reinforcement for your child's learning. Thanks for all you are doing to support this new process and any learning from home. This closure process was necessary due to public health guidance on COVID-19 and the safety and supervision of your child. <u>MTJB</u> – We are so fortunate to have pre-school and younger learners in daycare so close to our school environment.
