"When should I register my child for Kindergarten?" If your child will be 4 years old by December 31, 2021, then it's time to register. We have begun the process of Kindergarten registration for next year. If your child already attends our Junior Kindergarten program, there is no need to register them for Senior Kindergarten.

COVID-19 Screening and Late Drop Offs/Early Pick Ups

This is a reminder to complete your child's daily COVID-19 screening at https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/

Please, call us with any updates or if you need any help understanding the most current public health protocols. We are in this together as we stay safe and Mustang Strong!

Prior to a child being picked up/dropped off, please have the adult also complete the screener and wear a mask/face covering if coming to the Main Office door. Know that the Main Office area may be very busy, especially as we prepare for our day end. If you must do an early pick up, we ask that you let us know early in the day, and before 2:30 p.m., and pick up your child prior to 3 p.m. This keeps our regular dismissal process and timing safe and organized for all students.
