As I shared in our school Facebook post, I begin this newsletter with a heavy heart. On May 27, 2021 it was reported that the remains of 215 children were found buried on the site of the former Kamloops Indian Residential School. Sadness, shame, anger and guilt are just some of the feelings that may be experienced by people in our community and communities across Canada and our world. This finding reopens trauma for Indigenous students and their families. Their communities are bracing for more such discoveries. This finding brings forth the difficult work of our educators teaching and our students learning. We do this work together, with families and our school community, to better understand one another and to mend and strengthen relationships. We know that these conversations may create a wide variety of emotions and reactions with our students, so we share the following supports. We will continue the conversations as we connect Indigenous learning in all ways and times that we can, knowing that June is National Indigenous History Month. Our educators will continue to engage with age appropriate resources, listen carefully and acknowledge all feelings and questions. It is with deep honour and respect that we recognize Indigenous history and the diversity of First Nations, Métis and Inuit students and their families.
