### Questions and Areas of Concern

1. - 26 percent of students surveyed say they "never/sometimes" feel like they are a part of this school and that they belong as a Maynard Mustang

2. - 34 percent of students surveyed feel that they "never/sometimes" are excited to come to school every day as they have choices and a voice in learning.

5. - 22 percent of students "sometimes" feel safe on the yard

6. - 24 percent of students "sometimes" feel safe on their way to/from school

11. 38 percent of students surveyed "never/sometimes" feel like they are treated kindly by other students

### Follow Up & Actions

-our Principal of Equity and Inclusion, Dan McCrae, supported me to interview 13 students in late November who had said never/sometimes on multiple answers in their survey; we found out more details about their specific concerns and then was able to follow up on strategies for them to feel a sense of belonging, kindness and be safer and happier at school, particularly on the yard and the bus

-continue to check in on specific buses and yard zones and with students who expressed these as areas of concern

-letter sent home to all families of Bell bus #3155 to further their understanding of the tone on our bus and support a positive climate on the bus; some students ended up having the privilege of transportation revoked for a period of time

-with cohorting no longer in place, support educators and students to further choices and voices in how and what they are learning

-build excitement on the yard through new "toy bags" for each classroom to take onto the yard and support the management of the items

-vary supervision and boundaries so that students can play with a wide variety of peers and have space and choices yet still have adult supports when needed
